



Free recreation of the iconography of the Pachacamac sanctuary in the shape of a mandala in coloring books. MSPAC Team












Adaptation of the fish designs painted on the walls of the Templo Pintado. MSPAC Team














Mandala based on the iconography of the second section of the ídolo de Pachacámac. MSPAC Team












Taurichumpi. The central character wears a serrated half-moon headdress, like the Chimú deities of the northern coast. MSPAC Team












Mandala that shows the imperial Inca iconography. Geometric designs and representations of ferns, insects and more are deployed. MSPAC Team
